White Belts 10th Kups & 9th Kups

Yellow Belts. 8th Kups & 7th Kups

Green Belts. 6th Kups & 5th Kups

Blue Belts 4th Kups & 3rd Kups

Red Belts. 2nd Kups & 1st Kups

Black Belts. 1st & 2nd Dan Grades together

All competitors must compete wearing a white TAGB dobok or a TAGB tigers dobok

White belts (10th Kups) can perform Sajo Jirugi No 1 or No 2.

All coloured belts to perform pattern of their grade.

Black belts to perform any one of the three patterns of their grade.

All competitors MUST perform a pattern related to their grade. Each grade division is listed below in columns. Black Belts must perform a pattern of their grade as listed.
